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Foreword

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NOTE: The EBU/ETSI JTC Broadcast was established in 1990 to co-ordinate the drafting of standards in the specific field of broadcasting and related fields. This is the first public release of the PVR/PDR extension to MHP. The aim of the present document is to encourage implementations of:

- Receivers and middleware.
- Applications.
- Conformance tests.

DVB welcomes feedback from the developers of these implementations. Past experience suggests that this feedback will result in a revised version of the present document and that the first release of conformance tests for the PVR/PDR extension to MHP will address such a revision.

1 Scope

The present document defines the extension to the MHP specification supporting the recording of digital television content. It includes the scheduling of recordings, the management of scheduled recordings, the playback of completed recordings and the management of completed recordings. It includes the recording and playback of MHP applications that form part of the digital television content being recorded. It includes access to the metadata and content resolution mechanisms defined by TV-Anytime.

3 Definitions and abbreviations

3.1 Definitions

For the purposes of the present document, the terms and definitions given in TS 102 817 [6] and the following apply:

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complete piece of content: content between two DVB-SI event boundaries

content recording and access policy: policy controlling the ability for MHP applications from one broadcaster to use content from a different broadcaster

MHP 1.0: generic term for ES 201 812 [1] and its predecessors when known as TS 102 812 [2]

MHP 1.1: generic term for TS 102 812 [2]

MHP-PVR terminal: MHP terminal additionally conforming to all mandatory requirements of the present document

recordable application: MHP application which is signalled as to be recorded along with a piece of TV content and which does not rely on dynamic data or on synchronization with audio/video

timeshift: simultaneous recording and playback of digital television content such that the playback can be paused while recording continues hence enabling playback to continue at a later time with the possibility that none of the content has been lost

timeshift buffer: the buffer on the storage medium of the MHP-PVR terminal that is used for when timeshift behaviour is in operation

NOTE: The present document is intentionally silent about whether this is a fixed size buffer (e.g. 5 minutes) or a variable size buffer (e.g. all free space on the device).

transport keys: well known VCR control keys (play, pause, fast forward, fast rewind, etc.)

NOTE: These never go directly to MHP applications and are exclusively reserved for any manufacturer PVR/PDR user interface within the navigator.

tva_id: the "TV-Anytime event identifier" defined by TS 102 323 [4]

4 Conventions

Where modifications to other documents are defined by quoting text from those other documents and describing how the present document considers that text to be changed, text that the present document adds into the original document is shown underlined and text that the present document removes from the original document is shown with strike-through.

The present document uses the terminology that something "shall be recorded", "should be recorded", "shall not be recorded" or "should not be recorded". This is a convention for the sake of brevity and in all cases, implementations are allowed to record items that "shall not be recorded" and discard them during playback. The term "shall not be recorded" is simply shorter than "shall not be recorded, or if recorded, shall be discarded during playback" and the latter is what is meant.

5 Basic Architecture

5.1 Relationship with MHP and GEM Specifications

Implementations of the present document shall additionally implement all mandatory requirements of either ES 201 812 [1] or TS 102 812 [2].

NOTE: Future versions of the present document may remove ES 201 812 [1] from the above and require implementation of all mandatory requirements of TS 102 812 [2].

All normative clauses of TS 102 817 [6] shall apply regardless of whether the clause is explicitly mentioned below.

5.2 Overview (informative)

Figure 1 shows an overview of the architecture assumed by the present document. A number of aspects are omitted for the sake of clarity.



Figure 1: Simplified Architecture of MHP-PVR

In figure 1, the core of the architecture is the list of recordings and the recording manager. The list of recordings includes both pending and completed recordings. Pending recordings may include ones fixed in terms of time and duration on a specific TV channel as well as ones which can move in either time or channel - e.g. ones defined by DVB-SI or by the TV-Anytime CRID. Among other things, the recording manager is responsible for:

- managing pending recordings;
- interfacing to the recording engine when recordings are to be performed;
- interfacing to an implementation of the TV-Anytime content referencing mechanism for pending recordings defined by a TV-Anytime CRID;
- updating the status of recordings in the recording list as they are made.

Some pending recordings may be for more than one item of content, (e.g. a series identified by a CRID) in which case the list of recordings grows when a recording is made as the completed recording is added to the list of recordings. The original series recording request remains in the list as still pending until all elements of the list have been recorded.

MHP-PVR applications can use the recording management API to:

- request recordings to be made;
- to manage pending recordings;
- to search for pending or completed recordings which match certain criteria.

MHP-PVR applications can use the TV-Anytime content referencing API to access the implementation of the TV-Anytime content referencing mechanism. Pausing of the current "live" TV channel is supported via the timeshift API. Playback of completed recordings is supported via extended versions of the existing MHP media playback APIs.

Items that have been omitted for clarity in the above description include:

- a user interface to the recording manager provided by the receiver manufacturer;
- a database for TV-Anytime defined metadata and an API to access that database;
- mechanisms to enable accurate recording techniques to use by the recording engine.

5.3 General requirements

The following requirements of ES 201 812 [1] shall also apply to the packages defined in the present document:

- Clause 11.2.7 "Event model in DAVIC and DVB APIs".
- Clause 11.2.5 "Event listeners".
- Applications shall not define classes or interfaces in any package namespace defined in the present document. MHP terminals shall enforce this using the SecurityManager.checkPackageDefinition mechanism.

6 Recording and playback process

6.1 Managing scheduled recording

In addition to the activities defined in clause 6.1 of TS 102 817 [6], the process for managing scheduled recordings shall include the activities:

- 1) cross referencing the set of pending recordings with scheduling information to identify changes in the schedule and to schedule recordings not previously scheduled which can now be scheduled;
- resolving conflicts between individual pending recordings regardless of whether the recording originated via the API(s) defined in the present document, via a user interface provided by the manufacturer of the MHP-PVR terminal or even via an in-home network;
- NOTE: The present document intentionally does not define any specific algorithms or mechanisms for resolving these conflicts. The only requirement is that implementations include such a mechanism.
- 3) optionally discarding recording requests which are still in a pending state once their validity period has expired (but not before this);
- 4) optionally discarding failed recording requests once their validity period has expired (but not before this).

The handling of multiple requests to record the same piece of content is implementation specific. Some implementations may treat this as a conflict and resolve it via whatever mechanism they provide for resolving conflicts. Other implementations may logically merge the recording requests also merging the recording properties if they differ.

It is implementation dependent whether attempts are made to update the following information between when a recording request is first scheduled and when the recording process starts:

- 1) broadcaster permissions for any recording requests marked as not having been checked for broadcaster permissions (see clause 9.1.2 Determining broadcaster permissions);
- 2) DVB-SI descriptive metadata associated with the recording request.

6.2 The recording process

In addition to the activities defined in clause 6.2 of TS 102 817 [6], the recording process shall include the following activities:

- 1) Performing accurate recording using the mechanisms defined in clause 11 of TS 102 323 [4].
- 2) Acquiring the broadcaster permissions for the pieces of content in the recording as defined in clause 9.1.2 Determining broadcaster permissions. If evaluating the broadcaster permissions according to clause 10.1.1 Common Core determines that permission for recording is to be denied (see "Make a scheduled record request"), the recording shall not be started and the recording request shall transition to the FAILED_STATE.
- 3) Associating with the recording the DVB-SI descriptive metadata (title, synopsis & extended event descriptor) for the piece of content which makes up the largest proportion of the recording and that for all complete pieces of content found in the recording. Any descriptive metadata previously associated with the recording request is discarded.
- 4) Associating broadcaster permission descriptors with recordings as follows:
 - for recordings defined by DVB-SI event_id, (both with and without time and duration being specified), the broadcaster permission descriptor for the specified DVB-SI event_id shall be stored;
 - for recordings defined only by time and duration (without tva_id or event_id), the broadcaster permission descriptors for all DVB-SI events in that interval shall be stored.
- NOTE: Recordings defined by time, duration (without either tva_id or event_id) are intended to be used where EIT present/following are very out of step with the content. In this case, broadcaster permissions descriptor changes will also be (very) out of step with the content to which they refer.
- 5) Generating segments for each DVB-SI event in a recording request that is specified solely by time and duration and which spans more than one complete piece of content as determined by DVB-SI event boundaries.

The protocols for transmitted timelines referred to by TS 102 817 [6] shall be both the synchronized auxiliary data as defined in TS 102 823 [5] and DSMCC normal play time as defined in ES 201 812 [1] and TS 102 812 [2].

6.2.1 Identifying streams to be recorded

In the present document, the term "recordable streams" used in TS 102 817 [6] shall be interpreted to mean those streams defined in clause 7.2 of ES 201 812 [1] and TS 102 812 [2].

Identifying the streams to be recorded shall be done as follows:

• for each type of recordable stream, if the number of streams of each type present is less than or equal to the limits in the recording capability of the MHP-PVR terminal then all the streams of that type shall be recorded;

NOTE: Minimum capabilities for recording streams are defined in clause 15 of the present document.

• where more streams of any one type exist than the MHP-PVR terminal can record, the decision on what to record shall be according to clause 11.4.2.3 of ES 201 812 [1] and TS 102 812 [2].

6.2.2 Identifying and recording MHP applications

Identifying recordable MHP applications shall be done as follows:

- If an application does not rely on dynamic data and does not rely on synchronization with audio/video and if this application is signalled as to be recorded (the scheduled_recording_flag in the application recording descriptor is set to '1'), then the application shall be recorded.
- If an MHP-PVR terminal is able to reconstruct during playback the timing of the delivery of dynamic data then it should record applications that rely on this as long as they do not rely on other features the MHP-PVR terminal does not support.

- If an MHP-PVR terminal is able to reconstruct during playback timing of synchronization to audio/video then it should record applications that rely on this as long as they do not rely on other features the MHP-PVR terminal does not support.
- In all other cases, recording that application is not required. This includes MHP applications without specific recordability signalling (i.e. without an application recording descriptor in their AIT).
- NOTE 1: Implementations are however free to attempt to record more applications than are required and play them back. Substantial care is needed to offer the end-user the experience that was intended by the developer of the original program.

During the recording process, the MHP-PVR terminal shall:

- 1) monitor for changes in the AIT or AITs as defined in clause 10.4.2 "AIT transmission and monitoring" of ES 201 812 [1];
- 2) capture all AITs which are detected by this monitoring process;
- 3) identify all recordable applications listed in that AIT and start capturing those applications and associated streams as defined by the application recording descriptor.

NOTE 2: It is implementation dependent when the MHP-PVR terminal captures the application.

6.3 Managing completed recordings

In addition to the activities defined in clause 6.3 of TS 102 817 [6], the process for managing completed recordings shall include the following activities:

- 1) Deleting the recording at some point once the expiration period is past. There is no requirement for this to be accurately enforced, either by deleting the recording or by making it inaccessible through the API.
- 2) Maintaining with all completed recordings the following information:
 - All successfully captured AITs, applications and associated streams except for those associated with pieces of content which have not been completely recorded and which do not form the largest proportion of the recording. The retention of these is implementation dependent.
 - The descriptive metadata associated with pieces of content in the recording as defined above.
 - Any access rights which that broadcaster defined for applications not coming from them.

6.4 Playback

The process for playback shall be as defined in clause 6.4 of TS 102 817 [6].

During the playback of content recorded as the result of a scheduled recording, the following behaviour shall be supported.

6.5 Timeshift

The process for timeshift recording and playback shall be as defined in clause 6.5 of TS 102 817 [6] with the following clarification:

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- 1) All streams within the service shall be recorded including those carrying dynamic data such as MHP application signalling, DSMCC object carousel(s), stream events and MPEG-2 private sections to be accessed via the section filtering API.
- 2) All applications within the service are considered to be recordable unless explicitly excluded by having the time_shift_flag in their application recording descriptor set to '0'.
- 3) During playback, all recorded streams shall be decoded as if a live broadcast was being decoded, and the timing of dynamic data shall be reconstructed.
- 4) The MHP-PVR terminal shall associate a timeshift buffer with the service context created by the MHP navigator in which the user interface of the navigator selects services. The present document does not define mechanisms to associate timeshift buffers with other service contexts.

6.6 TV-Anytime

In a TV-Anytime environment, the following additional activities are required as part of the "managing scheduled recording" process defined in clause 6.1 Managing scheduled recording above:

- 1) resolving requests to record group CRIDs into their constituent elements.
- 2) monitoring when an additional resolution information becomes available for incompletely resolved CRIDs and acting on that additional information.

In a TV-Anytime environment, the following additional activities are required as part of the "recording" process defined in clause 6.2 The recording process above:

- 1) Associating with completed recordings all CRIDs that were signalled with the content at time of recording using the content identifier descriptor defined in clause 12 of TS 102 323 [4].
- 2) Associating the corresponding TV-Anytime metadata with recordings where any of the following pieces of content have CRIDs signalled with the content identifier descriptor:
 - the piece of content which makes up the largest proportion of the recording;
 - all complete pieces of content found in the recording.
 The corresponding TV-Anytime metadata for a CRID is defined as follows. For a group CRID, it is the GroupInformation. For a leaf CRID, it is the ProgramInformation and segmentation information if signalled. If instance metadata is available for the selected instance, it over-rides equivalent fields in the ProgramInformation.
 Segmentation information shall always be acquired at the end of a recording so as to include dynamic information. Other metadata may be acquired at any point during the recording.
 If a metadata database was specified when the recording was specified, the metadata shall be obtained from that database. Otherwise the database to obtain the metadata is implementation dependent with the constraint that databases in the transport stream carrying the content to be recorded shall be used if they

3) For recordings defined by tva_id, the broadcaster permission descriptors for all DVB-SI events in scope of the specified tva_id shall be stored. Where the content to be recorded spans more than one DVB-SI event_id, the LeafRecordingRequest shall have segments for the piece of content which makes up the largest proportion of the recording and for all complete pieces of content in the recording.

7 Metadata

7.1 TV-Anytime

NOTE: The present document does not define functional profiles or levels of the TV-Anytime specifications. One place where such activity is happening in the DTG TV-Anytime Test Bed project, see Bibliography.

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7.1.1 Definition

The metadata defined by clause 8 of TS 102 323 [4] shall be supported.

7.1.2 Transport by broadcast channel

Metadata transport as defined by clause 9 of TS 102 323 [4] shall be supported.

TV-Anytime metadata fragments obtained from a DVBDatabase shall include fragmentVersion and fragmentId attributes values which are obtained from the corresponding fields of the encapsulation structure defined in TS 102 822-3-2 [3]. Any existing values found in the fragments will be discarded and replaced.

- The 24-bit unsigned integer fragmentId field shall be represented by a hexadecimal string in the XML as would be accepted by java.lang.Integer.parseInt(String s, 16).
- The 8-bit unsigned integer fragmentVersion field shall be represented by a long value in the XML.

7.1.3 Transport by interaction channel

Metadata transport as defined by of TS 102 822-6 [3] shall be supported.

8 Application model

8.1 Playback of recorded applications

Clause 9 of TS 102 817 [6] shall be supported and additionally constrained as follows:

• When playback leaves trick-mode and returns to normal, MHP-PVR terminals may delay re-starting applications for up to one minute. The behaviour for this minute is implementation dependent.

8.2 Service contexts and support for virtual channels

MHP-PVR terminals shall be able support at least the following service contexts simultaneously:

- a) the service context created by the MHP terminal implementation that in MHP 1.0 is used by the navigator to present broadcast services;
- b) a service context created by MHP-PVR applications which could be used for the presentation of virtual channels.

Both of these can be used by MHP-PVR applications for the presentation of both broadcast and recorded content.

Simultaneous support for these service contexts shall include support for executing MHP applications simultaneously in both service contexts. This shall include two instances of the same MHP application should an application running in the service context for broadcast applications happen to be started as a result of the playback of recorded content.

NOTE: The intended use case for the above is virtual channels where the application controlling the virtual channel is running in the service context for normal broadcast applications and is selecting the content making up the virtual channel in a second service context which it has created.

8.3 Resource Management

The existing language in ES 201 812 [1] or TS 102 812 [2] clause 11.2.9 "Intra application media resource management" shall be extended to address the situation where an explicit request for media decoding resources by an application conflicts with existing resource usage associated with the service context in which that application is running. Specifically, if an MHP application requests the presentation of audio and/or video content and this needs to re-use the video and audio decoders used to present the currently selected service in the service context in which that application is running, those decoders shall be used for the newly requested presentation and shall no longer be used to present the video and audio of the currently selected service. Hence if an MHP application running in one service context creates another service context and then selects a service containing video and audio in that other service context, the selection in the second service context shall, if necessary, take media decoding resources away from any service being presented in the first service context.

8.4 Modifications to MHP 1.0 application model specification

When the present document is used in devices supporting ES 201 812 [1], the following changes shall be assumed to the text found in that document:

a) In clause 9.1.6, the following text:

"only a single application with a given Application identification is allowed to run at any time"

shall be assumed to be changed as follows:

"only a single application with a given Application identification is allowed to run at any time **in a single service context**".

9 Application signalling

9.1 Recording specific security attributes

9.1.1 Signalling

The following descriptor is defined in order to enable one broadcaster or operator to signal the rights which they wish to grant (or exclude) to MHP applications from other organizations. This descriptor is defined for use in the SDT and the EIT. When used in the SDT, the scope of this descriptor is that service. When used in the EIT, the scope of this descriptor is the event concerned.

descriptor_tag: This 8 bit integer with value 0x7B identifies this descriptor.

this_organization_loop_length: This 8-bit field gives the total length in bytes of the following loop.

this_organization_id: This field identifies the MHP organization_id or ids of this broadcaster, i.e. the one providing the content in the scope of the descriptor.

other_organization_id: The MHP organization_id of another broadcaster whose MHP applications this broadcaster wishes to grant or deny access to the content to which this descriptor refers. The value of '0' is a wildcard meaning all organization_ids except those explicitly listed in this loop and except for this_organization_id. If the value of the this_organization_id field is explicitly listed, the fields associated with it shall be ignored.

The following 1 bit fields are flags. When set to 1, the broadcaster identified by this_organization_id permits (or excludes) MHP applications from the broadcaster identified by other_organization_id from performing the identified operation on content within the scope of this descriptor.

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The default for content not in the scope of one of these descriptors shall be equivalent to a descriptor with the other_organization_id field being zero and all the following fields being zero.

9.1.2 Determining broadcaster permissions

The process for determining the broadcaster permissions for a piece of content to be recorded is as follows:

- 1) Determine if the SDT of the service containing the content to be recorded is available (without tuning), if not mark the recording request as not having been checked for broadcaster permissions and continue with step 7.
- 2) Determine if EIT information is available (without tuning) for the content to be recorded, if not mark the recording request as not having been checked for broadcaster permissions and continue with step 7.
- 3) If no DVB-SI event_id was specified in the recording request, determine one from the EIT information based on the time and duration specified in the recording request.
- 4) Based on the event_id, determine if a broadcaster permission descriptor for this content is present or absent in the EIT, if one is present, use this definition of the permissions and continue with step 7.
- 5) If a broadcaster permission descriptor is absent in the EIT, check for one in the SDT of the service for the content to be recorded, if one is present, use this definition of the permissions and continue with step 7.
- 6) If there is no broadcaster permission descriptor present in the SDT, use the default permissions.
- 7) End of determination process.

In the above process, if the piece of content to be recorded is listed in the EIT present/following table then the references to EIT above shall refer to the EIT present/following. Otherwise the references to EIT above shall refer to the EIT schedule.

Implementations shall attempt to determine the broadcaster permission descriptor for a recording request as follows:

- at the time a recording request is first made (or first resolved in the case of a recording request specified by a TV-Anytime CRID);
- at the time the corresponding recording operation starts and each time a new DVB-SI event starts during the recording. Any changes of broadcaster permission descriptor during the duration of an event shall be ignored.

The most recently determined broadcaster permissions shall apply in the event of conflicts. This includes conflicts between the broadcaster permissions determined at the time the recording operation starts and ones determined earlier as well as changes in broadcaster permissions when a new DVB-SI event starts during the recording.

If the recording request is marked as not having been checked for broadcaster permissions at the time the request is first made, implementations may repeat the attempt to re-acquire the broadcaster permission descriptor before the corresponding recording operation starts. This is however not required.

9.2 Signalling for application recording

9.2.1 Application recording descriptor

The application signalling defined in clause 8 of TS 102 817 [6] and the application recording descriptor defined in annex A of TS 102 817 [6] shall be supported. For the av_synced_flag, trigger events are as defined in clause B.2.4 of ES 201 812 [1] and TS 102 812 [2].

9.3 Extensions to application signalling

The present document extends the application control codes defined in clauses 10.6.2.1 and 10.6.2.2 of ES 201 812 [1] and TS 102 812 [2] as follows:

9.4 Modifications to MHP 1.0 application signalling specification

When the present document is used in devices supporting ES 201 812 [1], the following changes shall be assumed to the text found in that document:

a) In clause 10.5.2, the following text:

"Only a single instance of an application with a particular application identifier is allowed to execute at any time. So, if an application is already running then another instance of the same application shall not be launched."

shall be assumed to be changed as follows:

"Only a single instance of an application with a particular application identifier is allowed to execute at any time **in the same service context**. So, if an application is already running **in a service context** then another instance of the same application shall not be launched **in that same service context**."

10 DVB-J platform

10.1 PDR

10.1.1 Common Core

Clause 7 of TS 102 817 [6] shall be supported.

The behaviour of methods depending on recording request specific security attributes is defined as follows:

1) Where the application calling the method is from the same organization as the broadcaster of the content addressed by the recording request (as defined by the this_organization_id field in the broadcaster permission descriptor), there shall be no restrictions. No method shall throw org.ocap.shared.dvr.AccessDeniedException under these circumstances. Recording requests for that content shall always be visible to such applications.

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2) Where the application calling the method is from a different organization from the broadcaster of the content addressed by the recording request, the restrictions shall be as defined in table 5.

The restrictions defined in this table manifest themselves in the specifications as any of the following:

- the throwing of AccessDeniedException for methods defined to throw that exception;
- RecordingChangedEvents not being sent to a RecordingChangedListener;
- RecordingRequests not being returned by RecordingManager.getEntries.
- 3) User initiated recordings made by the end-user using the user interface of the navigator shall be visible to MHP applications as user initiated recordings and the normal policy governing the visibility of these shall apply. It is implementation dependent whether any application initiated recordings made by the navigator (i.e. without involving the end-user) are visible to MHP applications.

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If a recording includes both timelines as defined by DSMCC Normal Play Time and timelines as defined by TS 102 823 [5] then instances of TimeLine shall be returned for the timelines defined by the latter and not the former.

10.1.2 DVB Extensions

The org.dvb.pvr and org.dvb.pvr.navigation packages shall be supported.

All instances of org.ocap.shared.dvr.RecordedService created by the MHP-PVR terminal shall be instances of org.dvb.pvr.DVBRecordedService.

All instances of org.ocap.shared.dvr.LeafRecordingRequest created by the MHP-PVR terminal shall be instances of org.dvb.pvr.DVBLeafRecordingRequest.

The signalling for CRIDs in the method DVBRecordedService.getCRIDs shall be the content identifier descriptor as defined in clause 12.1 of TS 102 323 [4].

Implementations shall provide a mechanism to separate user and application initiated recordings as identified by the userInitiated parameter to the constructor of the DVBRecordingProperties class. This mechanism shall ensure that applications do not abuse the user-initiated recording mechanism to make what are in fact application initiated recordings. The present document does not require any specific mechanism. One example of a mechanism would be for the implementation to show a user interface dialogue to the end-user for them to explicitly approve (or not) each user initiated recording but not to show such a dialogue for application initiated recordings. Where it is necessary to distinguish between a user-initiated action and an application-initiated action (e.g. an application attempts to delete a user-initiated recording) a similar mechanism is required.

10.1.3 Related Content

The org.dvb.media.rct package shall be supported. This shall map onto the promotional links mechanism that is defined in clause 10 of TS 102 323 [4].

10.2 TV-Anytime

10.2.1 Content referencing

The org.dvb.tvanytime.resolution and org.dvb.locator,content packages shall be supported.

When the method org.dvb.tvanytime.resolution.ResolutionResponse.getChildren returns a vector of ContentLocation objects, references to DVB locators in the resolution result shall be represented by instances of org.dvb.pvr.DVBContentLocation.

10.2.2 Metadata

This org.dvb.tvanytime.metadata and org.dvb.xml.jdom packages shall be supported.

The classification schemes defined in annex A of TS 102 822-3-1 (V1.2.1) [3]shall be supported by the platform with the exception of the ActionTypeCS. These resident classification schemes can be referenced using the aliases listed in table 6.

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Classification Scheme aliases shall be supported by all methods of the ClassificationScheme class where a string value is used to reference a classification scheme or a controlled term. In methods which include a database argument, the platform shall first attempt to resolve aliases against the CSAlias information provided by the specified database. If this fails it shall attempt to resolve them against the aliases used for the inbuilt Classification Schemes. Aliases shall also be supported where string values are used to reference controlled terms in the DatabaseQuery class. The platform shall attempt to resolve these aliases against the CSAlias information provided by database to which the query is addressed. If this fails it shall attempt to resolve them against the aliases used for the inbuilt Classification Schemes.

Downloadable classification schemes shall be supported by all methods of the ClassificationScheme class that include a Database argument.

The FieldIDDefinitionList.getInstance() method shall return an instance supporting all the fieldIDs defined in clause 5.1.1.1.2 of TS 102 822-6 [3] and an additional fieldID called "DVBContextPath".

The CapabilityDescriptionsListener interface allows applications to be informed of the capabilities of an IPDatabase. When the postCapabilityDescriptions method is called the description argument shall contain a "describe_get_Data_Result" element as defined clause 7.1 of TS 102 822-6 [3].

10.3 Integration between PDR and TV-Anytime

10.3.1 TV-Anytime based recording

The org.dvb.tvanytime.pvr and org.dvb.tvanytime.pvr.navigation packages shall be supported.

All instances of org.ocap.shared.pvr.RecordingManager shall be instances of org.dvb.tvanytime.pvr.navigation.CRIDRecordingManager.

10.3.2 Content Identification API

The org.dvb.si.tva package shall be supported including both the Explicit and Indirect CRID signalling modes defined in clause 12 of TS 102 323 [4].

10.4 Version properties

The properties listed in the following table shall be included in the property set of the java.lang.System class. Thus these properties can be retrieved using java.lang.System.getProperty(). Since this API returns a string, numeric return values shall be encoded as defined by java.lang.Integer.toString(int).

The present document defines the following extended behaviours for the APIs defined in ES 201 812 [1] and TS 102 812 [2].

10.5.1 User Settings and Preferences API

The user settings and preferences API defined in clause 11.9.2 of ES 201 812 [1] and TS 102 812 [2] shall be extended as follows:

- An additional standardized preference shall be defined "Recording List Access".
- The encoding of this shall be as follows String whose value is "true" if the end-user allows access to the list of all content recorded in the PDR otherwise "false".
- NOTE: The additional preference is not included in the list of those accessible to unsigned applications therefore it is only accessible to signed applications.

10.5.2 DVB Service Information API

The DVB service information API defined in clause 11.6.1 of ES 201 812 [1] and TS 102 812 [2] shall be extended as follows:

- Classes implementing org.dvb.si.SIEvent shall also implement org.dvb.si.tva.ContentIdentifierQuery as defined in the present document.
- If an MHP application running as part of the playback of recorded content tries to access service information, then it shall obtain it from a currently available live broadcast and not from the recording.

10.5.3 Application discovery and launching APIs

The Application discovery and launching APIs defined in clause 11.7.2 of ES 201 812 [1] and TS 102 812 [2] shall be extended as follows:

• The class description of org.dvb.application.AppsDatabase shall be considered to be extended as follows:

Applications whose control code is PLAYBACK_AUTOSTART (as defined in clause 9.3 Extensions to application signalling) shall not be considered as "available" or "currently available" as defined here when they are signalled as part of a service being played either live or in timeshift mode. When part of a service being played from a recording, they shall be considered as "available".

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15 Minimum Platform Capabilities

Clause 11 of TS 102 817 [6] shall be supported. Additionally MHP-PVR terminals shall support:

- For scheduled recording, the simultaneous recording of at least one video elementary stream, at least two audio elementary streams and at least two subtitle streams.
- The monitoring for changes in metadata accessed through the DVBDatabase class of one query where all the results for that query are derived from modules signalled in the same DII. If results span more than one DII, at least one will be monitored. If multiple queries all map to data derived from the same DII then monitoring of all of them shall be supported.
- If the time-shift buffer has a fixed size, that fixed size shall be at least 5 minutes. If the time-shift buffer has a variable size, the MHP terminal shall have a means to clear at least 5 minutes which can be usable in the conformance testing process.
- NOTE 1: This fixed size is defined for the purposes of conformance testing and should not be used by application or MHP terminal developers as being indicative of the capabilities of commercial products.
- NOTE 2: The present document does not define minimum values for key parameters within the TV-Anytime specifications. Such activity is happening in the DTG TV-Anytime Test Bed project, see Bibliography.
